#### International collaboration in marine sciences...

- is state of the art
- has a long tradition e.g. ICES (since 1902), IOC (1960), CIESM, HELCOM, OSPAR,...
- is structured through various international scientific programmes with a strong marine participation (WCRP, IGBP: WOCE, CLIVAR, JGOFS, IMBER, LOICS,...)

So everything is fine?



#### **Draw backs**

- Collaboration of scientists are often based on individual interests and contacts
- Support on governmental level lacks continuity
- Funding problems as the respective national funding programmes are not harmonized
- ➤ Too many initiatives with overlapping tasks especially the landscape has evolved from focusing on separate sectorial issues towards the inclusion of more integrated aspects



### Challenges in creation international collaboration

- ➤ How to arrange agreements for a common strategic research and innovation agenda?
- How to establish a well-functioning joint decision-making and management mechanisms?
- How to achieve stronger integration in exploiting the existing infrastructure and how to develop in future research and innovation infrastructure jointly?
- How to engage stakeholders, industry, policy and the public?
- How to integrate human capacity building?



## Examples for collaboration in research funding Best practice?

- Experiences with different instruments:
  - Bi- and Multilateral joint calls (e.g. Bilateral co-operations, Wadden Sea call, Belmont Forum, ...)
  - ERA-Net(+), ERA Net Cofund
  - Joint Programming Initiatives (JPI), e.g. pilot actions on emerging issues
  - Joint Technology Initiatives (JTIs), Art. 185, EUREKA, Technology
    Platforms
- Lessons learned on essential elements:
  - Variable Geometry: Partners can decide freely if they want to participate in a specific activity or regional / thematic focus
  - Strategy needs to be supported by participating states on ministerial level (support by programme owners)
  - Clear and single evaluation, funding & reporting line for all research partner
