- Long term perspective - Transatlantic cooperation should include better education in civics, entrepreneurship, and IP in grade and high schools – generational change required

James Casey, J.D.: Session 7 – Enhancements

- Short term - Lessons from successful international collaboration - inform enhanced Transatlantic S&T cooperation
 - Articulate common custom principles re research within the new agreement
 - IP annex to the forthcoming S&T agreement – refer directly to U.S. Bayh-Dole Law or state some principles of Bayh-Dole within – the more specific the better
 - How can custom and cultural differences be bridged? Examples?
- Long term – Stronger education in civics, entrepreneurship, and IP – grade school through college – pipeline must be strengthened on both sides of the Atlantic
