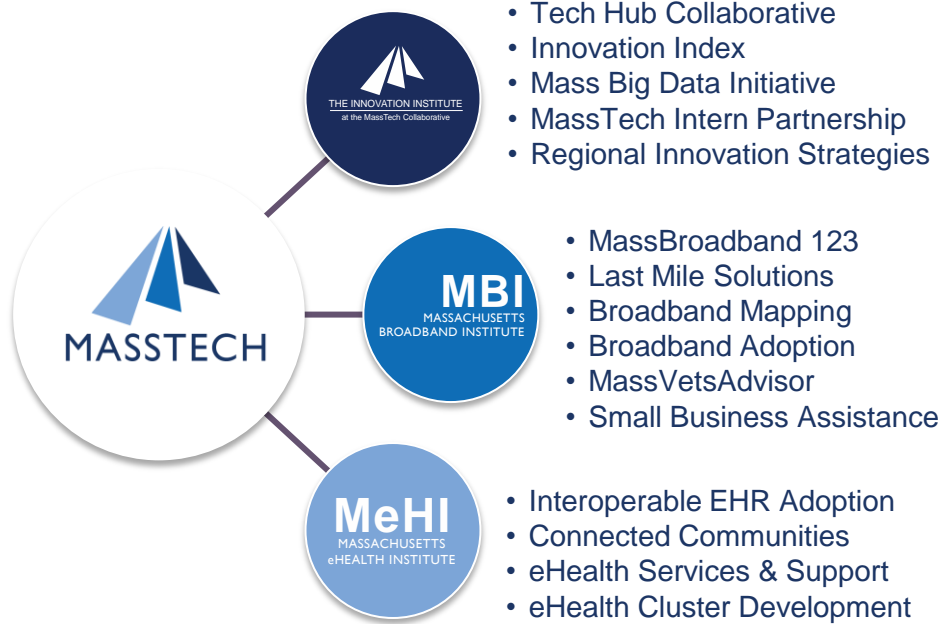


eHealth Cluster Development in Massachusetts

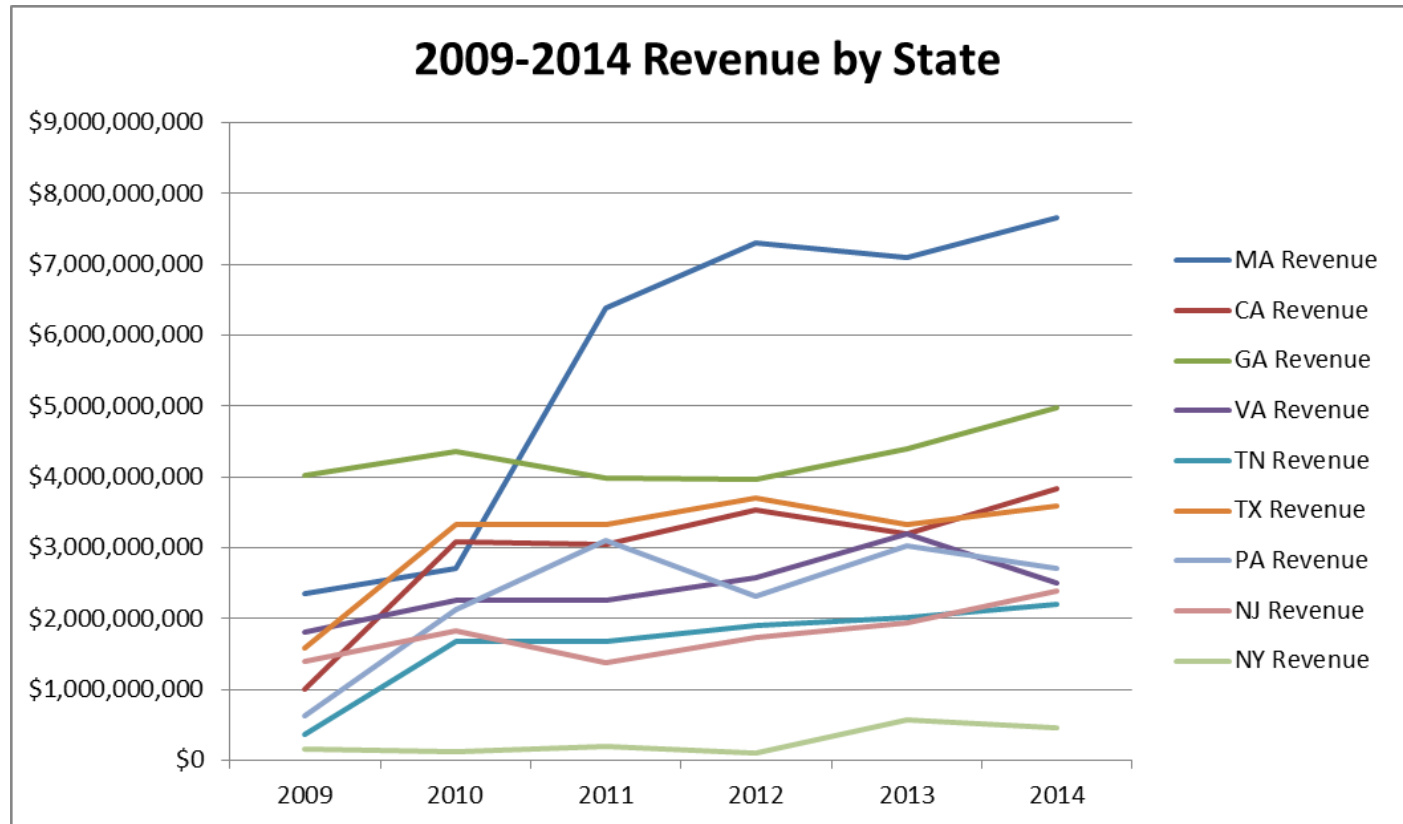
Advantageous Environment for Cluster Growth

 - Rock Health ranks Massachusetts #2 for fertile ground for digital health entrepreneurs

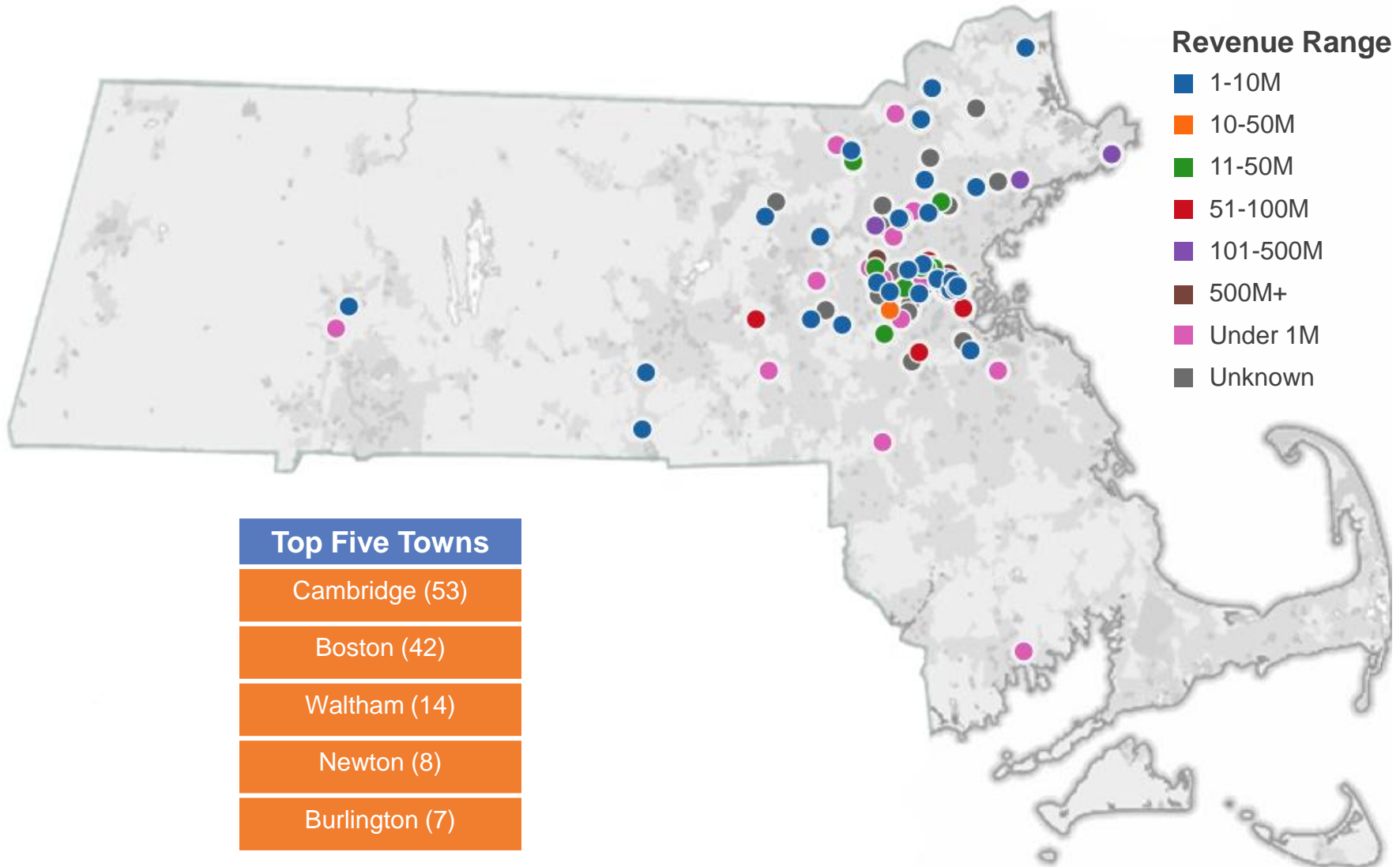

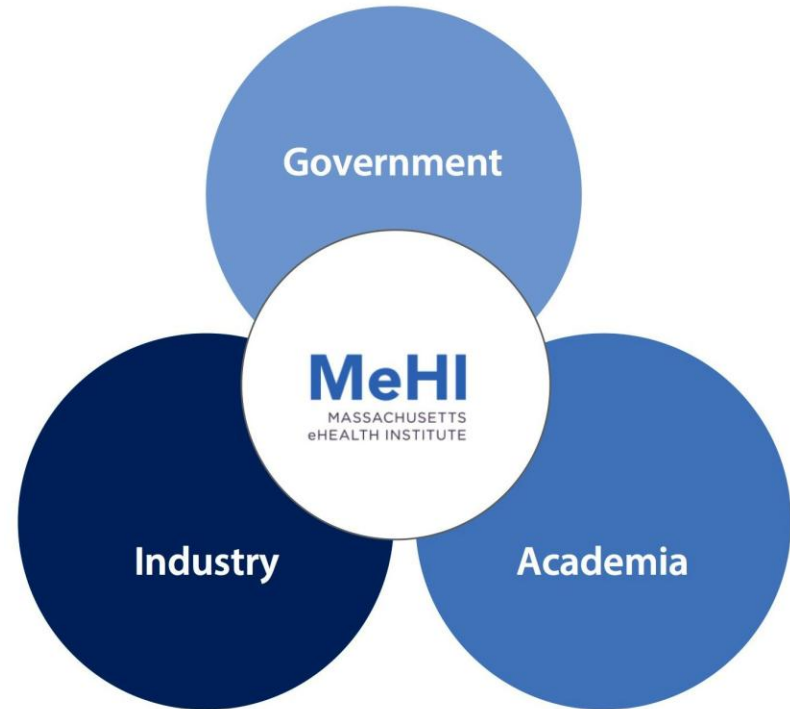
